Residents are referred to facilities from the Conditional Release Board, Probation, Drug Court, Caribbean Haven or the Counseling Centre. The Bridge Foundation meets the requirements of U.S. charities under U.S. tax law.

The Bridge Foundation has the anchor house as a 'bridge' to transitional living. The three bedroom, 2,500 sq. ft. sober living home is well furnished, spacious and clean, and equipped with the right structure and resources to facilitate sobriety. Live-in house managers are on-site and present daily to help to help residents learn or relearn life skills, self-care, and enforce standards that promote introspection and staying on the right course. The Bridge Foundation fosters drama-free, healthy sober environments where residents can grow in recovery.
